The role of the Capacity Builder is to engage, empower and co-create resources that improve service access and community engagement with Gay, Bi, and other men who have sex with men (GBMSM), the transgender (trans) community and people living with HIV & AIDS. The worker will deliver programming that includes peer-led activities, social media, special event and bar outreach and other projects using the principles of GIPA/MIPA.

Required Skills and Experience

- Post-secondary education in Health Promotion, Social Work or related fields.
- A good working knowledge of HIV/AIDS, STI's, the social determinants of health and health/social issues disproportionately affecting trans and GBMSM communities.
- Excellent interpersonal, facilitation and communication skills
- The ability to work in a team environment while possessing a high degree of initiative
- Experience in project coordination and the delivery of training programs
- Demonstrated success in coordinating projects with multiple stakeholders.
- Committed to anti-oppressive principles and practices
- Strong understanding of social media and outline outreach platforms.

Duties and Responsibilities

Project Coordination:

- Assist to develop and implement training and capacity building activities.
- Development and updating of training modules and resource materials i.e. Train the trainer guide, On-line Outreach manual
- Oversees activities to achieve meaningful project participation with the targeted communities, service providers, and other interested parties.
- Develops logic models, work plans, evaluations and timelines relating to funder requirements.
- Plan, strategize and execute social media training and online outreach training initiatives for peers.
- Plan and develop special HIV testing events.
- Identifies and develops partnership opportunities with agencies, groups, clubs, and businesses in order to promote the health of target population.

Training:

 Develops and delivers training and workshop modules to meet the needs of the target populations and service providers.

Volunteer Management:

 Recruit, train, supervise and deployment of program peer volunteers, providing support, skills development, and motivation and performance evaluations.
